Sardonyx was worn by Roman soldiers to protect them in battle. Many of them wore Sardonyx rings with mages of Mars carved into them.

Allow 4 hours driving time from the Ogden/Layton areas to reach Cary. This allows for approximately a ½ hour for stops along the way.


Meet at the Exxon Station in Cary located the intersection of Hwy 20 and S. Main St at 10am on Saturday 8/19. We will leave for the site

FYI: This trip is for 6yrs & up.

Join Rio Tinto Kennecott at its Visitor Experience at Bingham Canyon Mine. Learn about the history of this amazing mine and see first-hand the gigantic scale of its operation, vehicles, and artifacts. Discover how ore gets refined to become copper, an essential element in today's technology. The Visitor Experience is dedicated to educating the public about the key role mining plays in modern life, safe mining practices and responsible environmental stewardship.

Founded in 1903, Kennecott's Bingham Canyon Mine is one of the largest man-made, open-pit excavations in the world. The operation is so immense, it can be seen from space. The mine operates 24 hours a day, 356 days a year. With over 20 million tons of refined copper ore produced in the past 120 years, it is one of the top performing mines in the world.

What to know before you go:

Be prepared for the weather, the Visitor Experience is completely outdoors. The weather at the mine is sometimes different than the rest of the Salt Lake Valley. On sunny days, it will be hot. Bring water, sunscreen, and sun protection. If it looks like it may rain, please consider a jacket or umbrella.

Minors under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult.

Stay inside the designated visitor area (always fenced or otherwise).

Use of drugs, alcohol or smoking/vaping are strictly prohibited. Firearms, knives, and other weapons are prohibited on all Rio Tinto Kennecott property.

We will be taking a shuttle to the mine overlook.

It is a self-guided tour. There are many exhibits for you to see and read about the mine, its history, and operations. You are welcome to take pictures of your visit, however professional photography is not allowed.

Gift Shop

The Bingham Canyon Lions Gift Shop, located in the visitor parking area, sells an assortment of items. From copper jewelry and trinkets to educational excavation kits, visitors of all ages are sure to find something special to take home with them. While there is a vending machine available with drinks, food is not available for purchase.


*We will meet at the Lark visitor parking lot at 9:30am. Be on time! We will be taking a shuttle and if you aren't there it will unfortunately leave without you.


