

## A Fun Fossil Facts

- 1. In order for a fossil to be considered a fossil, the remains, traces or imprints of an organism must be 10,000 years or older.
- 2. Sinosauropteryx was found in 1996 and was a non-avian dinosaur with feathers. Scientists found preserved melanosomes on the specimen which helped them determine that the Sinosauropteryx may have had a red and white tail feather.
- 3. Fossil finds show that some Crocodile relatives were herbivores. One Crocodilian Specimen found was only 20 inches long and so similar to mammals that they named it the "Cat Crocodile."
