- **June 18 2022: *The Great Salt Lake*: Selenite Crystals and more!**

Good Day all you Beehive Rockhounds! It's time for the June Field Trip Details! When: June 18th. What time: 09:00 AM, Meet at the North Ogden Park and Ride - just east of the 2700 north exit. Where are we going? Selenite/Gypsum Crystal Hunting at the Great Salt Lake in Corrine! And also a Spiral Jetty visit. I've heard stories about these Crystals for years, but have never been able to find them. We have enlisted the help of our Club member Expert, Jamie Livingston, and she will be our Guide. These are neat samples to have in your collection. Bring Bug spray, shovels, gloves, shoes and pants that you can get really muddy in, Extra water to clean crystals, and about anything else you can think of! Directions to the Spiral Jetty in case anyone can't meet up with us at 9am.

Take Exit 365. Turn right onto UT Route 13 (toward Corrine). A gas station is located in Corinne. Continue west for 18 miles (UT Route 13 becomes Highway 83). Follow signs to the Golden Spike National Historic Site (GSNHS) Visitor Center. Turn left onto Golden Spike Road and continue 7.7 miles to the GSNHS Visitor Center. There are bathrooms at the visitor center. Cell phone reception ends. From the visitor center, drive 5.6 miles west on the main gravel road (N Golden Spike Loop). At the fork in the road, continue left (west). There are signs directing you to Spiral Jetty. Drive 1.4 miles. At the fork in the road, turn right (southwest). Continue driving for approximately 9 miles. The road will curve north around Rozel Point. The road ends at a cul-de-sac parking lot directly above Spiral Jetty.
